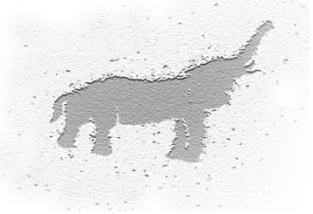

Legal Experience 1980-2007

Lisa practiced law for almost three decades in Madison, Wisconsin. From 1980 to 1985, she served as counsel to individuals, insurance corporations, transportation companies, and the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture. Between 1985 and 2007, she served as staff attorney to the Wisconsin Court of Appeals, researching and writing court opinions addressing issues in criminal, tax, municipal, utility and divorce law, civil procedure, corporate and commercial transactions, medical malpractice, trusts and estates, constitutional and real estate law.

Membership in AZA (Association of Zoos and Aquariums) 2001-2007

Lisa joined AZA in 2001. In October 2002, she circulated a white paper to AZA's Board of Directors seeking amendment of AZA's Elephant Management Standards to state a preference for positive reinforcement training and to protect the lifelong bond between female elephants and their female offspring. After months of industry-wide debate and discussion, the Board denied these requests.

In September 2005, she presented a paper, "A New Future for Zoo Elephants" at AZA's Annual Conference in Chicago, IL. Co-presenters on the panel included Terry Maple, Ph.D., former president of AZA and a founding editor of *Zoo Biology*. Approximately 220 conference participants attended the session.

Travel to Africa and Visits to Zoo and Sanctuary Elephant Programs in the United States, Europe, and Australia 2001-2012

On a trip sponsored by Oakland Zoo, Lisa traveled throughout Kenya in 2005 visiting key elephant conservation programs, including Save the Elephants in Samburu, the David Sheldrick Trust in Nairobi National Park, and the Amboseli Elephant Trust in Amboseli National Park, as well as visiting Masa Mara and Mount Kenya National Parks.

Between 2001 and 2012, she visited the elephant exhibits and programs at San Diego Zoo and San Diego Wild Animal Park, Riverbanks Zoo, South Carolina, Zoo Atlanta, National Zoo, DC, St. Louis Zoo, Columbus Zoo, Santa Barbara Zoo, San Francisco Zoo, Six Flags, Vallejo, CA, Milwaukee Zoo, Busch Gardens, FL, Henry Doorly Zoo, Omaha, NE, North Carolina Zoological Garden, Henry Vilas Zoo, Madison, WI, and Woodland Park Zoo.

Lisa visited the elephant exhibits at Berlin's Tiergarten and Heidelberg's Zoo in Germany in 2002 as well as Taronga Zoo, Sydney, Australia, in 2012.

Lisa visited The Elephant Sanctuary, Hohenwald TN in 2001, 2002, and 2006, and PAWS ARK2000, San Andreas, CA, in 2004, 2005, and 2007.

Coalition for Captive Elephant Well-Being 2004-2008

Lisa co-founded and was co-director of an *ad hoc* inter-disciplinary group, the Coalition for Captive Elephant Well-Being. Its membership included zoo industry professionals, veterinarians, animal behaviorists, academics, field scientists, animal welfare experts and public policy and law professionals. The group's purpose was to develop and disseminate science-based analysis and recommendations for institutions holding elephants in captivity.
